FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions)

Question	Answer
As a small group or organisation, can we be part of the advisory group and working group, but sometimes substitute a colleague to attend if one main person cannot commit?	Yes, your group or organisation is welcome to participate even if a named representative cannot attend every session. Substituting a colleague is possible.
Can we be part of the advisory group or working group in the early stages of programme planning and development, even if we may later wish to submit an application for a small grant once the grants process opens?	Yes, organisations can be involved in the early advisory or working group stages even if they may later choose to apply for a small grant. Should any conflict of interest arise, we will address each one as they come up. Further guidance on managing involvement alongside the grants process will be provided once the arrangements are confirmed.
What are the arrangements for expenses and/or compensation for time contributed?	Yes, there will be provisions for expenses and compensation for time contributed. However, the specific details and final arrangements are still under review and have not been finalised at this stage. We are working to establish a clear framework and will provide further updates as soon as they are available.
